What is our new learning?


In this topic we shall be learning:

Wider Curriculum



Literacy

This term in Literacy the children will be focusing on Dragons. They will be using lots of exciting adjectives and sentence starters to design and describe their own dragon. We will be learning how to write instructions and will writing a descriptive invitation for our medieval feast.

PSHE

We will be focusing on 'Think Positive'. This topic focuses on recognising and talking about their feelings that are both positive and negative. We also look at making good decisions.
